

DECLARATION

The great powers, including foremost Germany and the USA, which see Europe as a battle field for a coming world war, are sure that they have beaten the great power of the revolution but not yet defeated it. From Berlin to Leningrad, from Paris to Warsaw, from Madrid to Prague, from Athens to Donetsk, the revolt and resistance of the European proletariat, the great power which can end the misery of war, is growing again.

The European people are not without hope if they stay true to their history, which includes: that they are the guarantor for peace; that they are the guarantor by applying their own history to the present and carry it forward. To carry it forward means to recognise the merits of previous victories over the great powers and to utilise them as a guidance for the fight against the coming third world war. These merits are: The Paris Commune as the first example of how the crime against the people can be stopped. The Great Socialist October Revolution as a signal to the people of the world and as a proof that even a world war can be ended by a revolution. The fact that the workers of the Soviet Union ended the mass murder and genocide of German Fascism and liberated the European people. And the fact that they were the driving force for the establishment of People's Republics in Europe and provided world-wide support which ensured victorious revolutions against the war in Vietnam, China, North Korea and helped liberation movements in Africa.

The fight against the war, which can be witnessed on a daily base in Europe, needs to be reignited through the history of the European working class.

The participants of the meeting on 12/13 September 2015 in Munich therefore regard it as strictly necessary to use the 100th anniversary of the October Revolution in 2017 to forge a unity against the war across boundaries by bringing the "Class Struggle instead of World War" campaign to Leningrad.

The international campaign "Class Struggle instead of World War" asks of all those who are against the war and who are open to the great power of revolution to join this international campaign, through participation or other ways of support. To stop the great capitalist powers and their counter-revolutionary companions in the former socialist countries of Europe and prepare the exit from war for the people.
